Getting to the Lotterywest Summer Nights

To ensure public safety, there are road closures in place on 11, 12, 17 & 18 of January. The information below will help you plan your journey.

Road and Pedestrian Path Closures

- A map of the road closures is included at the end of this guide.
- Upon completion of the events, roads will be opened as soon as it is deemed safe to do so.
- The Elizabeth Quay footbridge will be closed to the public from 4pm – 9pm each day.

ACROD Parking

ACROD parking is available at:

- City of Perth Parking Convention Centre (21 Mounts Bay Road and Mitchell Freeway, Perth)
 - Due to road closures on William Street, the pedestrian and vehicle exit from the City of Perth Parking Convention Centre car park to William Street/Birdiya Drive will be closed during this event from 7pm to 9pm on the 11, 12, 17 and 18 of January only. Patrons are directed to exit via Mounts Bay Road and safely cross William Street at the pedestrian crossing.
- City of Perth Parking Terrace Road (165 Terrace Road, Perth)

Public Transport

- Elizabeth Quay is easily accessible by public transport, a short distance from the Elizabeth Quay Train and Bus Station and the Transperth Ferry terminal located in the inlet.
- SmartRider card holders can travel for free on all Transperth train, bus, and ferry services. SmartRider cards can be purchased at Transperth InfoCentres and selected SmartRider Retail Sales Outlets. Visit www.transperth.wa.gov.au/SmartRider/Retail-Outlets for more details.

Wheelchairs, prams and other wheeled vehicles are not permitted on escalators and passengers are required to use the lifts if travelling with these items.

Trains

Trains will run on a standard timetable from all stations. Please visit www.transperth.wa.gov.au for the latest information before you travel.

Armadale and Thornlie trainline:

- **Armadale/Thornlie Line** is shut until mid-2025. During the shutdown, there will be no train services between Armadale/Thornlie and Victoria Park. Trains will continue to operate from Platform 5 between Victoria Park and Perth stations.

Buses

- Buses will run on a standard timetable. Please visit www.transperth.wa.gov.au for the latest information before you travel.
- The free Blue CAT bus stops near the Bell Tower.

Roving Entertainment and Activities

There are many free entertainment options located around the Elizabeth Quay inlet. Here you will find a variety of roving entertainers, free children’s workshops and family fun.

On some nights roving entertainers will be moving about the space and include interactive performances, stilt walkers, and light-up costumes. Workshops and activities include giant bubbles station and a LED Hula Hoop play space. Below you will find more details on the roving entertainment and activities to help inform your visit.

Key Themes

Giant bubbles, hula hoops, stilt walkers, face painting, roving entertainers.

Considerations

Loud music, bright flashing lights, roving performers, soapy bubbles.

Interaction and Participation

Activity Information:

Patrons can partake in activities at various levels of participation. Operators can advise on how challenging an activity or workshop is and all activities can be viewed before deciding upon participation.

Workshop/Manual activity:

The hula-hoop workshops will require physical participation through hip movement, balancing and throwing.

Are participants expected to use materials or tools?

Yes, the hula-hoop workshops and bubble zone may require the use of props, including hula hoops, bubble wands and bubble blowers.

Is it okay for a parent or guardian to support an attendee in participation?

Parents and guardians can support attendees by accompanying them during the workshop or activity. Operators will advise parents and guardians when they cannot be involved in an activity to support their family member.

If an attendee is slower in their movements, is there a capacity to participate?

Yes, the activity staff are aware that all individuals have different movement speeds; if an attendee's movement is slower than other participants, it is encouraged that the parent or guardian brings this to the attention of the designated workshop staff.



Activity Durations

Workshops and activities can be engaged with for as long as an attendee desires.

Senses, Emotions and Effects

Some workshops require physical exertion, and the difficulty levels can vary depending on an attendee's capabilities. We recommend you observe others engaging with these workshops to determine if you or your family member can participate.

Venue Information

Entry: Workshops and activities are in an open, outdoor space, laid out across the inlet.

Enclosed or open space: Open spaces in an outdoor venue.

Density: The workshops are spread across 600 square metres however, are expected to become busy at different times of the day, particularly after 6pm.

Ticketed Amusements and Rides

A range of ticketed sideshow games and mechanical amusement rides will be available, including the Dream Swinger, Cup & Saucer and more. These are at the cost to the participant.

Below you will find more details the carnival amusements to help inform your visit.

Key Themes

Laughing clowns, swings, cup and saucer and other amusement rides.

Considerations

Heights, loud music, metallic clashing noises, long queues, crowded areas, large moving inflatable obstructions, bright flashing lights.

| Lighting level | Daylight with reduced lighting in the evening. Amusements and games run from 5pm to 10pm. |
| Flashing lights/strobe | Some amusement rides located within the Quay will include flashing lights. |
| Loud sounds or noises | Some amusement rides in this zone will include loud music and operational/mechanical clashing sounds. |
| Repetitive noises | Yes – at amusement rides and sideshow alley when they are in operation. |
| High-pitch tones | Yes – music, children screaming and laughing, regular mechanical noises. |
| Unexpected sounds | Yes – when the amusement rides first start after loading children. Children’s screams (potentially) for more scary rides. |
| Background music | Yes – music will be played in the background, and some amusement rides may have their music playing, this broadcast will be at a low level. |

Interaction and Participation

Activity Information:

Patrons can partake in activities at various levels of participation. Operators can advise on how challenging an activity is and all activities can be viewed before deciding upon participation.

Workshop/Manual activity:

The rides require you to be secured with no manual activity required; there are varying levels of intensity to the amusements.

Are participants expected to use materials or tools?

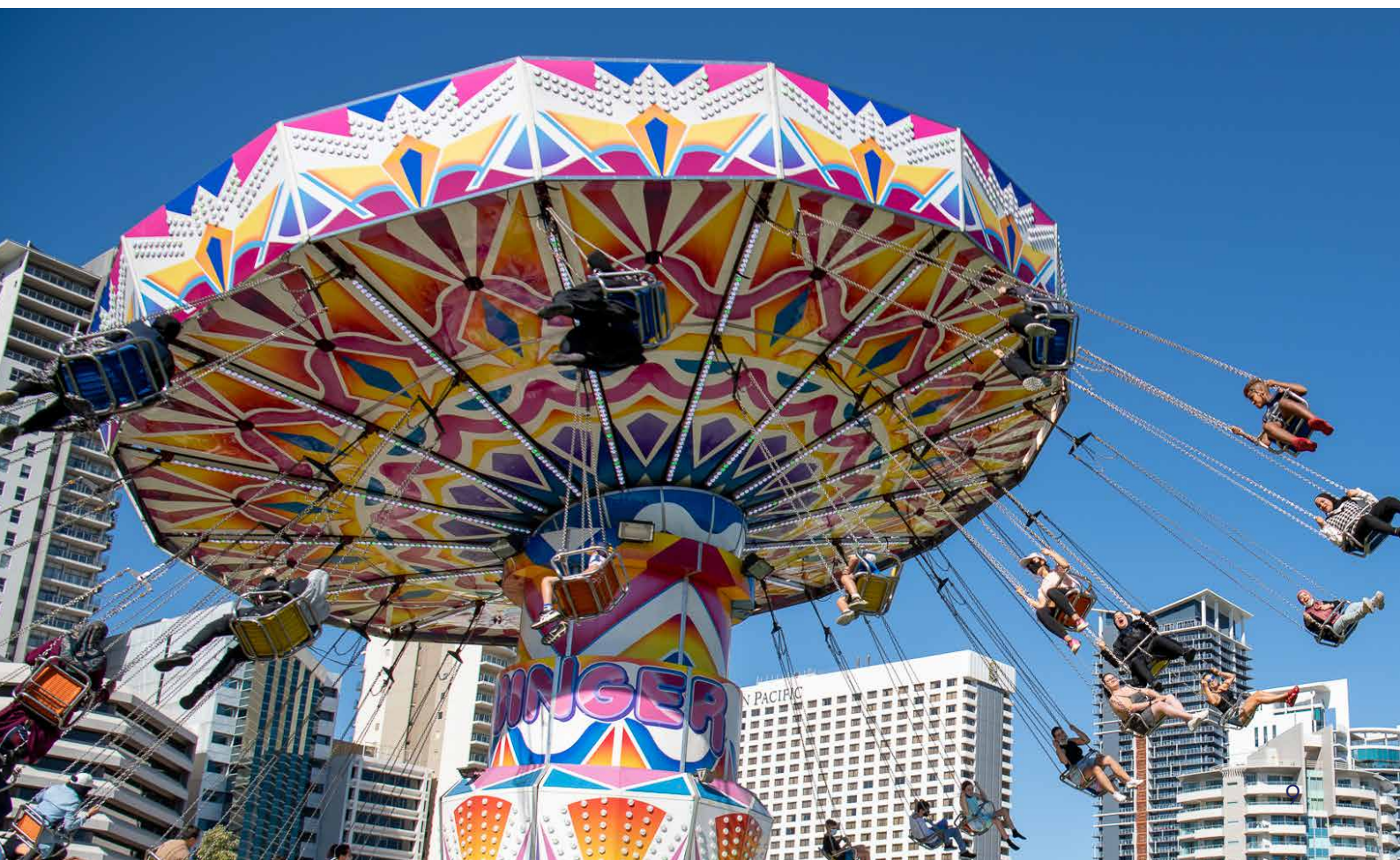

Is it okay for a parent or guardian to support an attendee in participation?

Parents and guardians can support an attendee by accompanying them in the following activities in this zone: Cup and Saucer, Fiesta Balloon, Fishing Pond and other amusements. Operators will advise parents and guardians when they cannot be involved in an activity to support their family member.

If an attendee is slower in their movements than others, is there a capacity to participate?

Yes, the amusement staff are aware that all individuals have different movement speeds; if an attendee's movement is slower than others, it is encouraged that the parent or guardian brings this to the attention of the designated amusement staff.



Activity Durations

Each amusement ride is expected to last between approximately two and a half minutes to four minutes long. Some amusements and games are more flexible than others and can be enjoyed for as little time as anyone would like, however others have a start and finish point with no exits throughout the ride. Parents are encouraged to consider their family member's ability to complete these longer obstacle courses and we recommend you discuss with the amusement operator if you are unsure of the activity.

Senses, Emotions and Effects

The Dream Swinger and Storm could be considered 'scary rides' with fast spinning movements and/or being upside down at a decent height. We recommend you observe others using these amusements to determine if you or your family member can participate.

Venue Information

Entry: Amusements are in an open, outdoor space, laid out across the Quay.

Enclosed or open space: Open spaces in an outdoor venue.

Density: The Amusements are spread across 600 square metres; however, they are expected to become busy at different times of the day, particularly after 6pm.

Stage Performance and Light Show

The center of this event is the floating stage in the center of the Elizabeth Quay inlet. Each night will bring a fresh celebration of Perth's dynamic summer atmosphere. The vibrant event lineup includes light shows, live music, movies, storytelling, and interactive performances. You can find a full program of the stage show [here](#).

The culmination of each night's stage show will be a close proximity fireworks display from the Elizabeth Quay footbridge. This is accompanied by a music soundtrack, broadcast from speakers along the inlet and the landing.

Accessible Viewing Area

- The Accessible Viewing Area will provide a fenced-off, non-crowded space for people with a disability, including people with sensory sensitivity, from 5pm – 9pm.
- The area is located in front of the carousel along the landing of Elizabeth Quay. There will be flag banners to mark this area.
- We advise you to arrive at the viewing area before 7pm as the areas around the enclosed zone will get crowded and will make it difficult to reach.

Auslan and Audio Description

Auslan Interpreting services and audio description will be available on 17 & 18 January from 5pm until 8.30pm for those with impairments. To book these services please contact **DADAA – (61) 400 111 018**.

Key Themes

Fireworks, flames, close proximity sparklers, colours, music, flashing lights, costumes.

Considerations

| Black out | Due to potential strobe and flashing fireworks that are displayed at night-time, there can be the possibility of attendees to have a reaction, resulting in fainting, dizziness and worst case, seizures. |
| Lighting level | It will be darker as the sun goes down from around 8pm. The stage show has large LED screens which have moving lights and colours. Close proximity flames and sparklers will be fired intermittently through the stage show. The fireworks will light up the sky and make the area brighter. |
| Flashing lights/strobe | Yes – the stage screens and fireworks have a strobe/flashing-like effect. |
| Loud sounds or noises | Yes – fireworks have a large ‘bang’ when fired. The stage show will be accompanied by a backing track through speakers to add to the exciting atmosphere. |
| Repetitive noises | Yes – fireworks will be repeatedly fired for 3 – 5 minutes at 8.30pm each night. |
| High-pitch tones | Yes – some fireworks have a high-pitched ‘whistle’ noise, and the stage show may contain high-pitched sounds. |
| Unexpected sounds | Yes – the fireworks will have a variety of different sounds at different times. The close proximity flames and sparklers may have hissing or unexpected sounds. |
| Background music | Yes – the City of Perth will be playing soundtrack audio on the speakers in Elizabeth Quay. If your child/attendee does not enjoy loud noises or music, we recommend bringing earmuffs to reduce noise during this time. |

Interaction and Participation

Activity Information

Elements of the stage show will encourage interaction through body movement. Patrons can partake in activities at various levels of participation.

Workshop/Manual activity

The stage show will have segments where hosts may encourage patrons to move and dance by following along with the entertainers.

Are participants expected to use materials or tools?

Is it okay for a parent or guardian to support an attendee in participation?

If an attendee is slower in their movements than others, is there a capacity to participate?

Activity Durations

Spectators can come and go as they please, however crowds will be dense at this time. On the 11, 12, 17, and 18 January, the firework display runs from 8.30pm – 8.35pm. On the 13 – 16 January, it runs from 8.30pm – 8.33pm.

Senses, Emotions and Effects

There will be distinctive smells from the fireworks, which may be stronger or weaker depending on the direction of the wind that evening. Smoke will be visible from the fireworks. There are a number of different special effects within the firework displays in the air above the Swan River.

Venue Information

Enclosed or open space: Open spaces in an outdoor venue.

Density: Crowd density will be high over the course of the stage show segments, with peak crowds expected around the firework display each night. The information (above) regarding the viewing area provides a 'safe zone' with other families who have a disability and a small relief from the anticipated busy crowds. Families are also welcome to wait in this zone, or the nearby Sensory Space, until some of the crowds disperse after 8.30pm, so it is less overwhelming upon departure of the event.

Lotterywest Sensory Space

The event atmosphere may be overwhelming or over-stimulating at times and somewhere quiet may assist to decompress. A dedicated 'Sensory Space' is available at this event and is located opposite the First Aid Post (refer to the map on page 15). The Lotterywest Sensory Space is an enclosed marquee with dim lighting and bean bags. Feel free to visit between 5pm to 9pm. Minors under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult in the Sensory Space.

Assistant Animal Relief Area

- An assistant animal relief area will be provided alongside the accessible toilets on Geoffrey Bolton Avenue.
- Dog bags, a water bowl and a bin are available for patrons needing to use the area with their support animal.

Food Options

- There is a variety of food and drink options around the Elizabeth Quay Inlet.
- All vendors will be happy to assist in taking your order.

Toilets

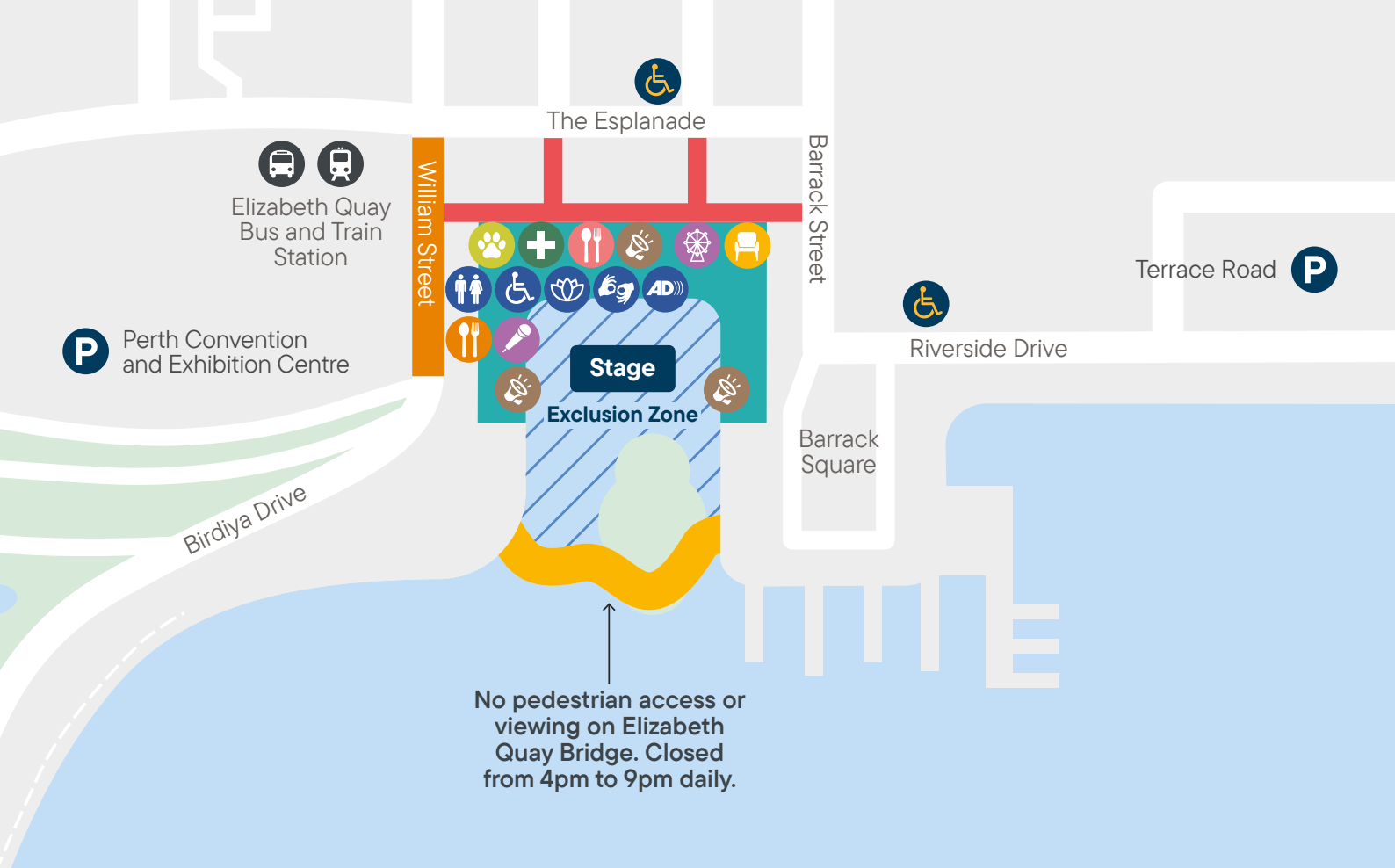
- There are two temporary accessible toilets and 30 all-gender toilets on Geoffrey Bolton Avenue.
- 8 permanent accessible toilet and adult changeroom can be found at the Elizabeth Quay permanent toilets on Geoffrey Bolton Avenue, and at Barrack Square.
- Refer to the maps for exact locations of the accessible and all-gender toilets.

Baby Change Rooms and Changing Places

- The parent's room and Changing Places facility exist in the permanent facilities in Elizabeth Quay.

Discrimination and Harassment
